Friends and Families of Krisalena Antoine Extend a Heartfelt THANK YOU

On the night of May 27, 2016 an electrical fire had started in the walls of my home; we had plugged a radio in an outlet we've never used and there was a blue spark that came from it. We thought nothing of it; as this was a common occurrence. Later on that night; I went to lay down and had noticed a bright orange colour from the loft, my music was on... and had decided later I will go up and turn my lamps off in the loft, and another ten minutes that bright light started to get brighter, I found that odd, I went to the bedroom door and saw flame crawling all across the ceiling.

I ran up half way up the stair case and saw flame and everything was ablaze; the walls, the couches, the rug everything. That fire was so fast and furious; I could not put it out on my own, feeling immobilized and scared. I ran down put my jacket on; then my boots, by the second boot; I felt this huge heat wave on my back I crawled out and ran to next door. At that time I saw someone run in to the house hollering to see if there was any one in there; I ran back to let him know I was ok and we both stood there watching the house burn; the rest, a blur.

Everything I have ever worked for; everything I was given out of honour, respect and love, everything that made me..ME.. all the tools I had accumulated for use at the turn of the seasons as a hunter/gatherer, my ceremonial regalia's my ceremonial objects, drums; feathers, rattles, medicine. All of the food supply I had gathered throughout the last year, my art portfolios, carvings, paintings, tools, passport, identity cards, music ...everything *gone*. As you know; this was the home of our grandmother the late Elsie August; which was then given to her granddaughter Sonia; who then opened it up to me and since I've called home. A wonderful home it was; I am grateful. Because of this unfortunate event; I've learned to move forward, and have made efforts in starting over. I could not have done so without the help of my friends and families who stepped forward and held me up throughout this loss. We had a fundraiser and the outcome of that seriously helped me get the necessities needed; donations throughout came in many forms; material objects; gift cards; money; support letters, emotional support and many other ways. Coldwater Membership,

RE: BE FIRE SAFE

As you may already be aware, there have been two house fires on the Coldwater Indian Band in the last two years.

Fortunately, both houses had full insurance coverage and there were no injuries to the home occupants. Check with Coldwater Housing to make sure that you are fully covered.

However, this has resulted in an increase in the premium as well as the policy deductible.

Please take the time to do what you can to make sure that your home is fire safe.

- Check your smoke detectors and make sure that they are operating properly.
- Clean your dryer lint trap a build-up of lint can cause a fire.
- · Report any faulty wiring to the housing department.
- Never over-plug an electrical outlet.
- Turn off power bars when not in use.
- Electronic devices can over-heat if left plugged-in/ in use too long and never store your electronic device on flammable materials (i.e. bed, clothes, etc)
- Clean around your house and yard of any combustible materials (i.e. wood piles, weeds, garbage etc.)
- Have a fire extinguisher handy and know how to operate.
- Clean chimneys and woodstoves and have the proper heat-shield in place.
- Keep flammable materials away from space heaters, hot water tanks, furnaces and woodstoves.
- Make sure gas stove are completely off after use and do not put flammables on the elements
- If using gasoline-powered devices, store gasoline in a locked location away from the house.

Fire safety is a concern for the entire community.

Coldwater Indian Band BAND TRANSFER POLICY

Coldwater Indian Band will consider an application for band transfer from a registered Indian from another Band providing that the applicant has a family link to Coldwater Indian Band.

"Family Link" is defined as spouse, mother, father, sister, brother, grandmother, grandfather, aunt or uncle.

"Spouse" is defined (for the purpose of this policy) as two people living together in a common-law relationship for at least one year.

All band transfer applications, except a minor child, shall be decided upon by secret ballot at a duly convened Coldwater General Band Meeting. There must be a minimum of 18 eligible voters present at that General Band meeting to vote on the band transfer application.

"Eligible Voters" is defined as a registered Coldwater Band member who is eighteen years or older.

"Minor Child" is defined as a child who is under the age of 18 years old.

A minor child of a registered band member shall be automatically accepted into Coldwater Band upon application by the parents. The child's parents must both consent to the child being transferred to Coldwater Indian Band by signing a *Statement of Consent* form and providing a large birth certificate. Where one parent has legal custody of child, then only that parent's consent is required. Upon receipt of the consent form, the Coldwater Indian Registry Administrator ("Coldwater IRA") shall prepare a Band Council Resolution for Band Council's signature. The Band Council Resolution shall be brought forth at the next duly convened Band Council meeting for approval.
